Summer Musical Theater

If you have ever dreamed of being on stage---this is your chance! Everyone will have a part! Everyone will learn character development, voice projection, expression, songs, and dances. Finish with a performance in full costume for family members.

Horticulture and Gardening

Do you love to grow things? Do you know the difference between dirt and soil, why plants need water, and what kind of "food" they use? Learn to care for flowers and landscaping. Cook with fresh fruits and vegetables. Try your hand at floral design. Field Trips to a local greenhouse and to pick your own vegetables and fruits.

Outdoor Recreation

If you love the outdoors in the summer, check this out! The primary goal of this activity will be to introduce the sport of Disc Golf. Learn basic rules, how to throw the discs for distance and putting, how to keep score, and the etiquette of the game. A portable basket can be set up anywhere to create a miniature course in the fields at the school. We will visit the Haverhill Disc Golf Association's 18-hole course at Clement Farm, Haverhill, as well as courses in Amesbury and Topsfield. Other activities may include flag football, wiffle ball, swimming at Plug Pond, and hiking in Haverhill at Winnekenni Park, John's Woods, Crystal Gorge, and Clement Farm.

Arts & Crafts

Are you creative? Do you like to learn new skills so that you can create homemade gifts, clothing or jewelry? In this activity, you will learn some basic skills such as Sewing and Beading, Wire Working, Jewelry Making, and more, based on the interests of the participants.

Healthy Living

Summer is a great time to relax, learn how to do some basic exercise and games, mindfulness, and healthy eating ideas. Field trips to local conservation areas and other places that will help you to stay healthy while having fun.

Service Learning " Social Media: Risks and Rewards -'Follow Us' "

Learn how social media can often pose problems and create negativity in our community and in our schools. Help find solutions to the ongoing negativity that social media can create, while learning some important leadership skills that will help you in all aspects of your life and teach you how to use social media for a positive purpose.
